Dear Mr. Kaye,

The \$2,500 contribution to a campaign committee for the General 2010 election referenced in item number one of your letter was rectified within 30 days by a refund from the recipient committee on November 3, 2010. That refund is reported on Schedule 14, page 26 of the original 30 Day Post General Report and the amended report filed December 17, 2010. Since the refund is from a General 2010 disbursement, the money is marked as General 2010. The amended report filed March 10, 2011 accurately reflects the election period and specifically notes the nature of the transaction.

The contributions referenced in item number two of your letter that were received after the 2010 Primary election and are listed as Primary 2010 are due to deficiencies in the compliance software. The software automatically and incorrectly reported them as Primary 2010, when they should have been marked Primary 2012. Each of these contributions was correctly entered in the database as Primary 2012, but the compliance software was unable to generate a report that displayed that information properly. Every contribution was received after the 2010 General election as evidenced by the date reported. The amended report filed March 10, 2011 accurately reflects the election period as Primary 2012 for these contributions.

The decrease in the amount of disbursements from the original to the amended 30 Day Post-General Report is due to a single check written to a national party committee that was not cashed.
