Dear Mr. Huckaby:

On March 6, 2002, you were notified that a review of the above-referenced report(s) raised questions as to specific contributions and/or expenditures, and the reporting of certain information required by the Federal Election Campaign Act.

Your March 14, 2002, response is incomplete because you have not provided all the requested information. For this response to be considered adequate, the following information is still required.

-Please provide further clarification regarding the source of the transfer(s) received by your committee from the "Nebraska Republican Party".

-In your letter you state that "The NRSC itemizes all credit card ultimate vendors to which the payment is over \$200 in calendar year..." Please note, 11 CFR §104.10(b)(4) states "A political committee that pays allocable expenses in accordance with 11 CFR §§106.5(g) or 106.6(e) shall also report each disbursement from its federal account or its separate allocation account in payment for a joint federal and non-federal expense or activity." Please amend your report by providing the mailing address, date, amount and purpose of payments that have been identified as "unitemized."



Adequate responses received on or before this date will be taken into consideration in determining whether audit action will be initiated. Requests for extensions of time in which to respond will not be considered. Failure to provide an adequate response by this date may result in an audit of the committee. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act may also result in an enforcement action against the committee. Any response submitted by your committee will be placed on the public record and will be considered by the Commission prior to taking enforcement action.
