Dear Mr. Evans:

This letter is in response to your request for additional information from the Republican Fund for the 90's, (FEC ID# C00281923) dated May 4, 1994 and received in our office on May 6, 1994.

1. Under 11 CFR 104.7 (b), the Republican Fund for the 90's has made its best efforts to obtain all the information required for contributors with a calendar year aggregate in excess of \$200.00. Attached please find a copy of the solicitation letter which clearly states that "Federal Election law requires us to report the following information: Occupation/Place of Business." The Republican Fund for the 90's understands that the revised 11 CFR 104.7 (b), which requires proof of follow up requests when the information is not initially received, was not in effect until March of 1994. Because the reporting period in question was 7/1/93 - 12/31/93, we were not required to request the information more than one time. However, if we do receive additional information related to the above mentioned report, appropriate amendments will be filed.

2. The Republican Fund for the 90's incurred limited administrative expenses in 1993 because, as the report indicates, there was limited activity. Most of the activity was related to initial fundraising and many of the administrative duties were performed by volunteers, on their own time. The Commission will note in the Title II report filed for 1/1/94 - 3/31/94, there is an increase in administrative costs. In addition, all debts and obligations have been disclosed under 11 CFR 104.11.
