We represent Perdue for Senate, Inc. ("Campaign"), and we have received your March 11, 2015 letter regarding the Campaign's 30 Day Post-General Report (10/16/2014 – 11/24/2014). Please find this letter responsive to your question.

Your letter asks one question:

Your amended report discloses an increase in debts owed to one or more vendors totaling \$288,896.95 on Line 10 of the Summary Page from those disclosed on your original report. Please provide clarifying information as to why this activity was not disclosed on your original report. (11 CFR § 104.3).

In the response to the prior RFAI for this report, we explained the following:

Further, as explained in our February 16 letter, after the 2014 general election, the Campaign engaged in a thorough audit of the primary, primary runoff, and general elections. That process revealed several obligations incurred with respect to the primary and primary runoff elections that were not previously known, or that were attributed to the wrong election. See 11 C.F.R. SEC 110.1(b)(3)(iii). The corrections will be documented on the forthcoming amended report.

As further response to your question, the Campaign initially erred when it deemed a \$400,000 loan from the candidate as a "Contribution." The loan was never intended to be a contribution but instead a quick infusion of funds to assist the Campaign in its continued operation while additional funds and fundraising events were forthcoming. When the Amended 30 Day Post-General Report ("Report") reflected the correct characterization of the \$400,000, the Campaign's overall debt increased. In addition to this, and as explained above, there were some significant late-coming invoices that were contingent upon facts that became known after the elections to which they were applied. When the invoices arrived and were paid, the debt number also changed.


