Neither AMPAC nor its constituent state associations will favor or disfavor anyone based upon the amount or failure to make PAC contributions. Voluntary political contributions are subject to limitations of FEC regulations Section 710.7, 710.2 and 710.3. Federal regulations require this notice.
