To Whom It May Concern:

After consulting with FEC staff, I file this statement for clarification.

This "committee" (Jonathon Moseley) made independent expenditures in support of Christine O'Donnell as candidate for U.S. Senate in the 2010 elections, and consistent with the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit decision in SpeechNow v. FEC,

Previously, Jonathon Moseley was also Christine O'Donnell's campaign manager in 2008 for the primary, and assisted her candidacy through June 2008 and was briefly Interim Treasurer for her campaign in early 2008.

This Committee previously explained that Jonathon Moseley had no communication or contact with Christine O'Donnell or her campaign, since around June 2008 at the latest July 2008, until November 2010, except purely in reference to seeking repayment of Moseley's expenses from the 2008 campaign, which were eventually retired. Moseley received two checks during 2010, but these were reimbursements of old expenses advanced to the 2008 Friends of Christine O'Donnell campaign.

During one exchange of emails in the first or second week of January 2009 about reimbursement of 2008 expenses, Jonathon Moseley accidentally learned that Christine O'Donnell had already decided to be a candidate for the 2010 election for U.S. Senate from Delaware by mid-January 2009. Those emails have been preserved in computer archives. From that one inquiry about expenses, Jonathon Moseley became a potentially important witness that disputed expenses of Friends of Christine O'Donnell in early 2009 were legitimate campaign expenses and were not personal expenses. Mr. Moseley may become a participant in presenting these facts, if necessary.

During the 2010 campaign, journalists sought to falsely fabricate controversy by trying to attribute any controversial (twisted and misrepresented) statement by others like me to Christine. And her campaign was swamped and unable to coordinate with others. Therefore, I chose to act independently to minimize smears by dishonest journalists. Being motivated to debunk those false smears, I did not wish to afford more opportunity for journalists to fabricate any more lies about Christine O'Donnell.

However, subsequent to the November 2, 2010, election, I have had many conversations with Christine O'Donnell and her campaign manager Matt Moran.


After the November 2, 2010, election, as a result of my extensive personal knowledge of events in 2008, my personal historical knowledge has become an important part of the O'Donnell campaign's work of reconstructing and corroborating events from 2008 in order to respond to an official complaint with the Federal Election Commission and elsewhere and also attacks in the news media and in public discussion.

Arising out of these discussions, I have done some work for the close-out post-election work of the campaign. Although I have not yet been paid, I have coordinated closely with Christine O'Donnell and Matt Moran subsequent to the November 2, 2010, election. There was no coordination prior to the election, but has been since then.

I inquired of FEC staff whether my relatively trivial personal expenditures should be converted to an "in kind contribution" reported by the Friends of Christine O'Donnell campaign. They replied that they were not familiar with a procedure for doing so, but suggested that instead I file this note clarifying that the situation changed dramatically after the election was over.

Although my actions after the November 2, 2010, election might confuse some observers, any coordination or cooperation has occurred only after the November 2, 2010, election was over.





