
Dear Mr. White,

I am in receipt of your letter of March 30, 2000. 80-20 PAC is aware of the fact we have not completely furnished you with all the information required originally in your letter of 3/8/00. Our letter of 3/17/00 was simply to assure your office that we will be responding as soon as we gathered all the information you required.

In the mean time, 80-20 PAC have filed amended reports for 7/1/99-12/31/99 and the monthly report for Jan/00. This is to correct and to explain that we had mistakenly reported all our office and administrative expenses as independent expenditures. They have now been corrected and reported as other operating expenses. This should take care of your questions on p.2 and 3 of your letter. Our PAC is primarily for voter registration and education. Except for the 2 independent contractors who work for us as paid consultants, all other workers are volunteers. No one receives any salary. Almost all communications are done via e-mail for which we pay several Internet service providers as reported.

Lastly, attached here are copies of solicitation forms and letters we used in fund raising. We realized less than twenty of the hundreds of contributors who donated over \$200 have not reported their employer and occupation. We are continuing to contact them for the missing information and will file amended report as soon as we receive them. I hope for now this is sufficient to demonstrate "our best effort".

It includes persuading presidential candidates to take pro-Asian American positions, getting Asian Americans to register and vote, organizing a block-vote in the general election, and paying our staff. All contributions are subject to limits and prohibitions of the Federal Election Campaign Act. That Law prohibits contributions from corporations, labor unions, and foreign nationals who have not been admitted for permanent residence. All contributions must be made from personal funds and may not be reimbursed by any other person. Each person who is a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident holding a green card may contribute up to \$5,000 a year.

1) How do I contribute to 80-20 PAC?

- Your contributions to 80-20 PAC are **not tax-deductible**.

2) What is a PAC?

A PAC is an individual or a group of U.S. citizens, a corporation, a labor party or a political party that contributes to candidates running for public office. A PAC is required by law to register and report contributions to the Federal Election Commission (FEC).

3) What is a non-connected PAC?

A PAC formed by an individual or a group of U.S. citizens that is not connected to a corporation, a labor party or a political party. A non-connected PAC can solicit contributions from the general public of U.S. citizens and permanent residents

4) Are political contributions tax deductible?

Political contributions are **NOT** tax deductible. This means that all donations must be made on an after-tax basis. The donor is responsible for all income taxes on all donations, whether they are made in cash, stocks or goods. In the case of stocks and goods, the donation amount is determined by the fair or prevailing market value on the date of giving.

5) What is the contribution limit to a non-connected PAC?

\$5,000 per person per year. A husband and wife may contribute \$10,000 in a single check even when only one spouse has income.

6) What is a joint contribution?

A joint contribution is a contribution that is made by two or more persons using a single check. If the persons are not

husband and wife, each contributor must sign either the check or an accompanying statement confirming that the contribution is from the personal fund of each donor.

A joint contribution is attributed equally to each donor, unless the donors specify differently. A partnership can make a joint contribution to a non-connected PAC.

7) Who audits 80-20 PAC?

80-20 PAC is required by law to make periodic reports to the Federal Election Commission. In addition, Mr. Tony Wong, CPA, of Wong and Co., NY, has agreed to audit our books pro bono.

8) Who are on the 80-20 Steering Committee?
