
Dear Senator McConnell:

This letter addresses a necessary change to the place where the NRSC files its campaign finance disclosure reports. Up until now, your committee has filed its reports with the Secretary of the Senate under an exception to the general rule requiring non-candidate committees to file with the Federal Election Commission. This exception was crafted to allow committees which restricted their support exclusively to candidates for the U.S. Senate to file with the Secretary of the Senate.

Over the past few elections, the NRSC has been consistently making contributions to candidates for the U.S. House of Representatives and, increasingly, to candidates for non-federal elective office. The governing regulation at 11 CFR § 105.2 that permits non-candidate committees to file with the Secretary of the Senate restricts this to "...other political committee(s) that support only candidates for nomination for election or election to the Senate of the United States ..." [emphasis added]. Our conclusion that the NRSC should be filing with the FEC was brought to the attention of your treasurer in letters from our Reports Analysis Division dated April 23, April 30 and May 7, 1997. To date, we have not received a response to this particular issue.

Since your committee no longer exclusively supports candidates for the Senate, we request that your treasurer henceforth file your designations, statements, reports and notices with the Federal Election Commission in accordance with 11 CFR §105.4.
