

Dear Mr. Matheson,

I am writing in response to your August 5, 2010, letter regarding three contributions disclosed on the Cantor for Congress July Quarterly Report that were not disclosed on the 48-hour notices of "last minute" contributions filed by Cantor for Congress prior to the June 8, 2010, Virginia primary election. Due to an administrative oversight, the three contributions identified in your letter were inadvertently omitted from the Cantor for Congress 48-hour notices. Cantor for Congress has consistently filed these notices even when Congressman Cantor has run unopposed as he did in the June 8 primary election. To avoid this problem in the future Cantor for Congress has enhanced its internal operating procedures in the following ways:

- 1) All agents of Cantor for Congress that receive a contribution on any day during the 48-hour notice period must either provide the Cantor for Congress Finance Director with the contribution or fax a copy of the contribution and email a spreadsheet with the contributor information required to complete the 48-hour notices.

- 2) The Cantor for Congress Finance Director will send an email each day of the 48-hour notice period to agents of Cantor for Congress engaged in fundraising requesting all contributions received or the contribution information that is to be faxed and emailed.
