Dear Mr. Igasaki:

This letter is prompted by the Commission's preliminary review of the report(s) referenced above. This notice requests information essential to full public disclosure of your federal election campaign finances. **An adequate response must be received at the Commission by the response date noted above.** An itemization of the information needed follows:

-Your 12 Day Pre Primary Report (1/01/06-3/01/06) and April Quarterly Report (3/02/06-3/31/06) discloses limited payments for administrative expenses. Administrative expenses are payments made for the purpose of operating a political committee including, but not limited to, rent, utilities, salaries, telephone service, office equipment and supplies. Each separate segregated fund and non-connected committee utilizing separate federal and non-federal accounts is required to allocate any administrative expenses according to a 50% flat minimum federal percentage unless the federal account elects to pay a higher cost. Schedule H1 must be filed with each FEC FORM 3X that discloses an allocable disbursement for administrative expenses, generic voter drives or public communications that refer to any political party. 11 CFR §106.6(c)

Any goods or services provided to your committee by a person, except volunteer activity (i.e., a person's time), would be considered an in-kind contribution from that person, and would be subject to the disclosure requirements of 2 U.S.C. §434(b)(3) and 11 CFR §104.13, and the limitations and prohibitions of 2 U.S.C. §§441a and 441b.


Clarification regarding administrative expenses should be disclosed during each two year election cycle beginning with the first report filed in the

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with the provisions of the Act may also result in an enforcement action against the committee. Any response submitted by your committee will be placed on the public record and will be considered by the Commission prior to taking enforcement action.

Electronic filers must file amendments (to include statements, designations and reports) in an electronic format and must submit an amended report in its entirety, rather than just those portions of the report that are being amended.
