Dear Mr. Kaye,

The itemized memo entries on Schedule A of the October Quarterly Report referenced in your letter are vendor credits posted to a credit card held in the committee's name. The credits did not increase the committee's cash on hand; they simply reduced the amount owed on the credit card statement. Reporting the credits as memo entries on Line 11(a)(i) is the only way the committee could report both the credits and all the purchases from the related credit card statement. Reporting the credits on Line 14 would artificially inflate the cash on hand figure since the credits simply reduced the amount owed on other purchases.
