BEST EFFORTS

Given that the majority of the contributions received are as a result of direct response solicitations and despite the fact that each appeal includes a clear and conspicuous request for the contributor information as well as occupation and employer; many of the donors do not provide that information on the initial request.

The committee has established procedures whereby the following steps are taken to satisfy the "best efforts" requirements: (i) within thirty (30) days of the receipt of the contribution, a letter is sent, clearly asking for the missing information, without soliciting a contribution; (ii) we inform the contributor of the requirements of federal law for the reporting of such information; and (iii) we provide a pre-addressed return envelope, a fax number and an email address. Upon receipt of the information the committee amends its reports to provide the new information.

The Commission has indicated that certain individuals have provided occupational descriptions that are considered unacceptable. The Committee's data entry specialists key the information provided by the donor and they make no distinction as to its acceptability. Through our "best efforts" mailings, the Committee has attempted to obtain more acceptable descriptions.

An amended report has been filed with the additional occupation and employer information collected.

SCHEDULE E - ITEMIZED TRANSACTIONS

The committee reported \$400,000 in Schedule E activity identified as MEMO entries with no corresponding itemized disbursements. The reason for that is that no payments related to that activity were made within the reporting period and no invoices received for that activity. The next report will disclose itemized transactions corresponding to the Schedule E memo entries.

SCHEDULE E - TIMELY REPORTING

The committee on June 1st began a program whereby voter contact calls would commence and continue for several weeks opposing Hillary Clinton for the office of President. The committee must file a 48 hour report with the FEC within 48 hours of any independent expenditures aggregating \$10,000 or more with respect to a given election. The costs of this program did not aggregate to \$10,000 until June 2nd, therefore the 48 hour notice was filed within the specified time frame when the committee filed Form 24 on June 4th.
