Dear Mr. Pooler:

This letter is prompted by the Commission's preliminary review of the report(s) referenced above. The review raised questions concerning certain information contained in the report(s). An itemization follows:

-On Schedule A supporting Line 11(a)(i) of the Detailed Summary Page, your report disclosed contributions from individuals that omit the dates of receipt. Please amend your report by supplying the information. 11 CFR §104.3(a)(4)(i)

-Your report includes computer produced formats of Schedule A, supporting Line 11(a)(i). Computer produced formats may only be used upon prior approval of the Commission. You should submit a separate sample format with a cover letter requesting approval. Until your format has been approved, FEC forms must be used. 11 CFR §104.2(d)

-Schedule A supporting Line 11(a)(i) discloses contributions received through what appears to be a payroll deduction plan. Generally, a committee's report must identify each contribution from an individual which in the aggregate exceeds \$200 during the calendar year. (2 U.S.C. §434(b)) In lieu of separate itemization, a committee using a payroll deduction plan may disclose the aggregate amount of contributions received from the contributor through the payroll deduction plan during the reporting period; the identification of the individual where the contribution exceeds \$200 in the aggregate during the calendar year; and a statement of the amount deducted per pay period. 11 CFR §104.8(b)

-Your report disclosed a category of financial activity that has been reflected on the wrong line of the Detailed Summary Page. Contributions to non-federal

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
committees (such as Salute to the President) should be properly disclosed on a separate Schedule B, supporting Line 29 of the Detailed Summary Page. Please refer to the instructions contained on the forms to determine the proper categorization when preparing your next filing.

-The identification of each contributor, including the person's occupation and name of employer, must be provided if the person has contributed in excess of \$200 in the aggregate during the calendar year. Please amend Schedule A supporting Line 11(a)(i) for each entry lacking a contributor's address.

Note: If your committee has made attempts, either by a written request or by an oral request documented in writing to obtain this information from each contributor, your committee may have exercised "best efforts." Under revised 11 CFR 104.7(b), such effort shall consist of an initial clear and conspicuous request for the name, mailing address, occupation, and name of employer of each individual who has contributed over \$200 in the calendar year which informs the contributor that the reporting of such information is required by law. If necessary, your committee must make a written follow-up request or an oral follow-up request documented in writing, within thirty days with no additional solicitation. Subsequently, the committee should report any changes provided by the contributor or any additional information which is in the committee's records. If you believe that your committee satisfies the "best efforts" provision, you should provide a copy of your solicitation or an explanation of the method(s) used to obtain contribution information. Clarification regarding "best efforts" should be disclosed during each two year election cycle beginning with the first report filed in the non-election year. 11 CFR §104.3(a)(4)(i)

A written response or an amendment to your original report(s) correcting the above problem(s) should be filed with the Federal Election Commission within fifteen (15) days of the date of this letter.
