Dear Mr. Walker:

This letter is forwarded in response to the subject inquiry, a copy of which is provided as enclosure (1) to this letter. As described in the transmittal letter accompanying the filing at issue, a copy of which is provided as enclosure (2) to this letter, we effected a change to our allocation ratio for shared expenditures as documented in Schedule III of our 30 Day Post-General Report filing. As prescribed under the Commission's rules, we applied a ratio of 89/11 to shared expenditures prior to the Post-General Report based on consideration of our prior Election Cycle experience and our estimate of current Election Cycle experience. However, by the time of our Post-General Report Filing, we had completed all of our candidate contribution activity for the election cycle, and realized that our actual contribution experience was considerably different than the estimate upon which we had relied. Therefore, we adjusted our allocation ratio as the Commission's rules require.

With specific reference to your inquiry, lines 21(a)(i) and 21(a)(ii) on our Twelfth Day Preceding General Election Report totaled \$236,262.19 and \$29,201.13 respectively based on our prior allocation ratio of 89/11. A restatement of these valuations based on the 77/23 ratio adopted in our Post-General Election yields \$204,406.76 and \$61,056.16 respectively. The net change in each set of valuations is \$31,855.43 (\$236,262.19 - \$204,406.76 or \$61,056.16 - \$29,201.13). Additionally, we initially posted transactions for the Post-General Report period based on the 89/11 ratio. This remained true until November 12. Therefore, the Ratio Adjustment transfer of \$34,057.71 we reported on

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line 18 of our Post-General Report needed to account for both the cumulative restatement of transactions that occurred prior to the Post-General Report period plus those that occurred between the start of the Post-General Report period, October 19, 2000, and November 12, 2000, the date our allocation ratio changed. The composite value of transactions during this interval totaled \$18,350.94, and the addition to the value of our November 12, 2000 transfer equaled \$2,202.28 ( $\$18,350.94 \cdot 12\%$ ).

The bottom line is that if one adds the Column A values of the Post-General Report for lines 21(a)(i) and 21 (a)(ii), or \$17,923.86 and \$5,353.92 respectively, to the corresponding Column B values reported in the Twelfth Day Report Preceding the General Election Report restated on an 89/11 basis, or \$204,406.76 and \$61,056.56 respectively, the values that appear in Column B of the Pre-General Election Report, \$222,330.62 and \$66,410.48 respectively, will result. Dear Mr. Walker:

I have enclosed for filing The National PAC, Inc.'s Report of Receipts and Disbursements for the period of October 19, 2000 to November 27, 2000.

Please note that we have effected a change in the ratio applied to our shared expenditures based on our actual 1999-2000 Election Cycle contributions (see Schedule H1). Previously, we had employed a ratio of 89/11 based on our estimated Election Cycle experience and that of the prior Election Cycle. However, we plan no further contributions to candidates this Election Cycle, and our actual ratio of Federal and non-Federal contributions thus far works out to 77/23. As noted on the Schedule H3 for Line 18 of this report, a transfer of \$34,057.71 was made into our Federal account on November 12 to account for the effect of the new ratio. The accuracy of our calculation may be verified by a comparison of lines 18 and 21(a)(ii) in this report. Except for a \$0.02 rounding difference, these amounts are equal as they should be.
