Dear Mr. Atkins:

This letter is prompted by the Commission's preliminary review of the report(s) referenced above. This notice requests information essential to full public disclosure of your federal election campaign finances. **An adequate response must be received at the Commission by the response date noted above.** An itemization of the information needed follows:

-Schedule B supporting Line 21 of your report discloses contributions from your committee to the following organization:

ASU Foundation/Bob Stump Endowed Chair \$75,000

This contribution may qualify as personal use if the organization is not registered as a charitable entity as disclosed in section 170(c) of Title 26 of the United States Code of the Internal Revenue Code. Copies of documents that govern these trusts and a description of how these funds are to be utilized may be used as a response to this letter.

If the organization is registered as a charitable entity, there could still be an issue of personal use if the candidate, a family member or other close associate (such as current or past employee) of the candidate is a paid officer, employee or consultant of the trusts. If there is indeed a violation of personal use of organization funds, the committee should seek reimbursement for the full amount of the personal use violation(s) from the beneficiary and notify the Commission in writing of such a reimbursement. The reimbursement(s) should be reported on Schedule A supporting Line 15 of the Detailed Summary Page of the report covering the period in which the reimbursement is received §113.1(g)(2).
