This letter is to inform you that as of December 6, 2000, the Commission has not received your response to our request for additional information, dated November 15, 2000. This notice requests information essential to full public disclosure of your federal election campaign finances. To ensure compliance with the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act (the Act), please respond to this request (copy enclosed).

An adequate response must be received at the Commission by December 27, 2000. Adequate responses received on or before this date will be taken into consideration in determining whether audit action will be initiated. **Requests for extensions of time in which to respond will not be considered.** Failure to provide an adequate response by this date may result in an audit of the committee. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act may also result in an enforcement action against the committee. Any response submitted by your committee will be placed on the public record and will be considered by the Commission prior to taking enforcement action.

Dear Mr. Kirincich:

This letter is prompted by the Commission's preliminary review of the report(s) referenced above. The review raised questions concerning certain information contained in the report(s). An itemization follows:

-Schedule H2 indicates the allocation ratios for JJ 2000 and DWC 2000 were revised during the reporting period. Please provide the date of the fundraising program or event. In the case of a telemarketing or direct mail campaign, the "date" is the last day of the telemarketing campaign, or the day on which the final direct mail solicitations are mailed. 11 CFR §106.5(f)(2) In the event that an excessive non-federal transfer was received, the excessive amount should be transferred back to your non-federal account.

-On Schedule H3 supporting Line 18 of the Detailed Summary Page, you have failed to provide a breakdown of transfers received by the federal account. Please amend your report to include the missing information.

-Itemized disbursements must include a brief statement or description of why the disbursements were made. Please amend Schedule H4 of your report to clarify the following description(s): "consulting fees", "sponsorship", and "reimbursement event expense". For further guidance regarding acceptable purposes of disbursements, please refer to 11 CFR §104.3(b)(3).

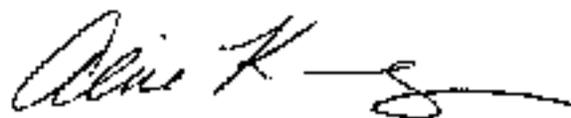
-Please clarify all expenditures made for "political ad", "media tracking", and "media buy" on Schedule H4. If a portion or all of these expenditures were made on behalf of specifically identified federal candidates, this amount should be disclosed on Schedules B, E, or F supporting Lines 23, 24 or 25 and include the amount, name, address and office sought by each candidate. 11 CFR §§104.3(b) and 106.1

-Commission records indicate the name of your political committee as the Georgia Federal Elections Committee. However, your committee files reports in the name of the Democratic Party of Georgia. Committee filings (disclosure reports and amendments) must reflect the official name of the committee which appears in your Statement of Organization. Please amend your report(s) to clarify this discrepancy and amend your Statement of Organization as appropriate.

-Schedule B supporting Line 23 of your report discloses a contribution(s) to a federal candidate for "Primary & General" (pertinent portion attached). However, you do not specify the amounts which should be attributed to each respective election. Please amend your report to provide clarifying information.

A written response or an amendment to your original report(s) correcting the above problem(s) should be filed with the Federal Election Commission within fifteen (15) days of the date of this letter.
