Dear Ms. Sugarman,

This letter is to clarify that the contested debt disclosed on the October quarterly report was actually just an incorrect billing issue. The campaign purchased a number of phone lines for their Special Election in May. Once that election was over, the campaign requested that the vendor, Time Warner, shut down those phone lines. Time Warner failed to do so, and continued to bill for them month after month. The campaign spoke with the representatives at Time Warner several times, and was assured by the vendor that they would have the lines shut down and the bills corrected. Because it took many months to complete this process, while the campaign continued to be charged for phone lines they were not using and had requested to be cancelled, the campaign chose to report it as contested debt until the issue was resolved.

After the October quarterly report was filed, Time Warner notified the campaign that they had resolved the incorrect billing issue. On the Year End report the Commission will note that the campaign has paid down the correct balance in full and will show the rest of the contested debt as forgiven.
