In response to your letter of October 18, 1995, we are providing the following information:

- On 11/2/95, the NRSC returned to the 1995 Republican Senate House Dinner Committee \$2,500.00 of the amount contributed to it by AFLAC. This will bring AFLAC's total contributions to the NRSC within its legally allowable contribution limit of \$15,000.00, in accordance with 2 U.S.C. 441a(f).
- The discrepancies concerning unitized contributions were caused by a one-time conversion tape issue which we have now resolved with our vendor. The NRSC's best efforts amendments incorrectly included in several contributor's year-to-date totals contributions that they made outside the reporting period of the amendment but before the tape was run to create the amendment. The total of the original Line 11a(i) is correct and does not need to be amended.
- Attached are copies of two solicitations sent to contributors by the NRSC in this cycle. In compliance with 11 CFR 104.7(b), these and all of our solicitations include the statement:


"Federal law requires political committees to report the name, mailing address, occupation and name of employer for each individual whose contributions aggregate in excess of \$200 in a calendar year."

Amendments to Line 11(a)(i) of the June monthly report were filed with our July, August and September reports based on responses to our second request for information. A copy of one of our "best efforts" request letters is also attached.

The NRSC continues to comply with the requirements of 11 CFR 104.7(b).

- The NRSC has amended Schedule H3 for the May report (4/1/95-4/30/95) to correct a typographical error. The original copy incorrectly listed the project codes as "C" codes instead of "D" codes.


Dear Mr. Spindler:

Enclosed please find our check #70268 in the amount of \$2,500.00 representing a refund to the 1995 Senate House Dinner Committee. The AFLAC, Inc. PAC exceeded its federally determined maximum contribution limit to the National Republican Senatorial Committee by \$2,500.00 when the NRSC's share from the PAC's contribution to the Dinner Committee was distributed. Therefore, we are required to return this over-limit amount to the Dinner Committee.

According to the NRCC, the AFLAC, Inc. PAC has not yet contributed the maximum allowable amount to the National Republican Congressional Committee. In reviewing the signed joint fundraising agreement for this year's Dinner, we note that you can transfer the above mentioned \$2,500.00 to the NRCC with the appropriate memo schedule, and a replacement \$2,500.00 of federal funds from another contributor can be transferred to the NRSC, maintaining the agreed-upon even distribution of all receipts to the Dinner.
