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On 9.22.2011, the Democratic Party of Wisconsin received a Request for Additional Information. We were asked to address five specific items. Our responses are outline below:

1.Schedule B and H4 of our report discloses payments for ?Intern Stipend.? These expenditures do not represent reimbursements to any individuals for travel or other expenditures.

2.Schedule H4 supporting Line 21 (a) discloses payments for ?health care reimbursement,? ?Payroll ? see memo,? ?dental/life insurance,? ?health insurance premiums,? ?salary? and ?FICA match.? These salaries, wages and fringe benefits were for employees who spent less than 25% of their compensated time in a given month on Federal Election Activity or activities in connection with a Federal Election.

3.Schedule H4 supporting line 21(a) of our report discloses payments for ?Robo calls,? ?sign printing? and ?communications consulting.? These public communications did not identify a candidate for Federal office, did not PSAO any candidate for federal office, and do not meet the definition of Federal Election Activity or activities in connection with a federal election.

4.Expenditures made to Madison?s downtown and described as ?Room rental for fundraising event? on our Schedule H4 were incorrectly described. This should have been described as a ?room rental for staff event.? This was a location used to for a staff briefing luncheon. No funds were solicited or raised.

5.On Schedule H4 the expenditures made for ?voter file consulting,? ?modeling for voter contact? and ?List acquisition? were expenditures that were not made for activity that promotes, support, attacks or opposes a Federal candidate. ?Voter file consulting? refers to the payments we make to consultants to improve our voter file database. ?Modeling for voter contact? describes activity used to categorize voters, this modeling was not done in connection with any federal election, or any federal candidate. This modeling did not identify any federal candidate, promote, support, attack or oppose any candidate for federal office. Again, these particular surveys conducted in April were not used on Federal Election Activity or any activities in connection with a Federal election. ?List acquisition? refers to the purchase of a list from another source, and was not done in connection with any Federal Election Activity, or any activities in connection with a Federal election.
