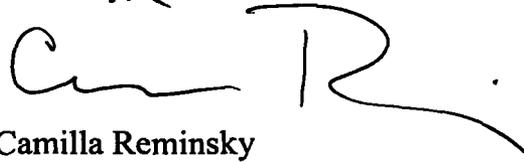

1. Column B figures for the Summary and Detailed Summary Page information should equal the sum of the Column B figures on your previous report and the Column A figures on this report. Please file an amendment to your report to correct the Column B discrepancies for Line(s) 15, 16, and all subsequent report(s) which may be affected by this correction. Note that Column B should reflect only the election cycle-to-date totals. (2 U.S.C. § 434(b))

2. Some of the contributions itemized on Schedule A of your report appear to have incorrect values in the "Election Cycle-to-Date" field. This field should reflect the total amount that the committee received from the contributor in the current election cycle, from 11/8/06 through the date of receipt of the contribution. (11 CFR § 104.3(a)(3)) Some of the election cycle-to-date totals reported on your Schedule A do not appear to include all contributions from the contributor received in this election cycle. Failure to correctly total contributions received from a given source in the election cycle could lead to acceptance of excessive contributions by the committee. Please note that this problem frequently occurs when the contributor name is entered in the committee's electronic reporting database more than once using a different spelling and/or format. This letter is prompted by the Commission's preliminary review of the report(s) referenced above. This notice requests information essential to full public disclosure of your federal election campaign finances. **Failure to adequately respond by the response date noted above could result in an audit or enforcement action.** Additional information is needed for the following item:

-In response to an inquiry made by the Commission regarding the relationship between UAW-V-CAP (UAW VOLUNTARY COMMUNITY ACTION PROGRAM) and AFL-CIO COPE PCC, you state that these "are not affiliated committees" and that they "operate under a combined collecting agent/joint fundraising arrangement." Your response appears to demonstrate that UAW-V-CAP could legally function as a collecting agent. However, UAW-V-CAP has not demonstrated that it has acted in a manner consistent with being a collecting agent under the Commission's regulations for the amounts transferred to AFL-CIO COPE PCC. To fulfill the requirements, UAW-V-CAP must transmit contributions to AFL-CIO COPE PCC within 10 or 30 days, have a transmittal account solely for AFL-CIO COPE PCC contributions or keep separate records of all receipts and deposits, forward all contributor identification information, and retain the required records for three years. 11 CFR §§102.6(c)(4), 102.6(c)(5), 102.6(c)(6), 102.8 Further, UAW-V-CAP would need to report the transfer of funds to AFL-CIO COPE PCC, which would in turn be required to report the full amount of each contribution received from the original contributor. 11 CFR §102.6(c)(7)

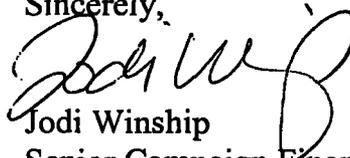
You are advised to implement changes in your procedures in order to comply with the provisions of 11 CFR §§102.6(c) and 102.6(b)(1).

Although the Commission may take further legal action regarding the failure to adhere to the requirements of a collecting agent, your prompt action in changing your procedures will be taken into consideration.

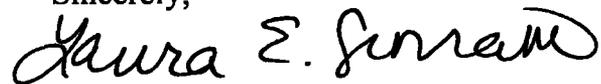

You should examine all of your contributions to check for additional excessive contributions. The Committee's procedures for processing contributions should also be reviewed.

An individual or a political committee other than an authorized committee or qualified multi-candidate committee may not make a contribution to a candidate for federal office in excess of \$2,300 per election. An authorized committee may not make a contribution to a candidate for federal office in excess of \$2,000 per election. A qualified multi-candidate committee and all affiliated committees may not make a contribution(s) to a candidate for federal office in excess of \$5,000 per election. The term "contribution" includes any gift, subscription, loan, advance, or deposit of money or anything of value made by any person for the purpose of influencing any election for federal office. (2 U.S.C. §§ 441a(a) and (f); 11 CFR §§ 110.1(b), (e) and (k))

If any apparently excessive contribution in question was incompletely or incorrectly disclosed, you must amend your original report with the clarifying information. If any contribution you received exceeds the limits, you may have to refund the excessive amount.

Excessive contributions may be retained if within sixty (60) days of receipt, the excessive portions are properly redesignated or reattributed. Guidelines for each option are provided below:

For reattributions, excessive contributions from individuals can be retained, if within sixty (60) days of receipt, the excessive amount is properly reattributed to another person. Please note that reattributions only apply to excessive contributions from individuals. An excessive contribution is considered properly reattributed if (1) the contributors provide the committee with written documentation, signed by each contributor, authorizing a reattribution and indicating the amount of the contribution to be attributed to each contributor, or (2) the committee reattributes, by presumption, the excessive portion of the contribution if the contribution was made on a written instrument from a joint account and was signed by only one of the account holders. In this case, the treasurer must notify the contributors in writing within 60 days of receiving the contribution that the committee intends to reattribute the excessive portion and must give the contributor an opportunity to request a refund. (11 CFR § 110.1(k)(3)(ii)(B))

For redesignations, the funds can be retained if within sixty (60) days of receipt the excessive amount is properly redesignated for a different election. An excessive contribution is considered properly redesignated if (1) the committee obtains signed written documentation from the contributor(s) authorizing the redesignation of the contribution for another election, provided that the new designation does not exceed the limitations on contributions made with respect to that election, or (2) your committee redesignates by presumption the excessive portion of the contribution for another election provided that the new designation does not exceed the limitations on contributions made with respect to that election. In this case, the treasurer must notify the contributor of the redesignation in writing within 60 days of the treasurer's receipt of the contribution. The notification must give the contributor an opportunity to request a refund. (11 CFR § 110.1(b)(5)(ii)(B)) Please note that you cannot presumptively redesignate an excessive contribution from a multi-candidate committee. Also, a contribution can only be redesignated to a

previous election to the extent that the contribution does not exceed the committee's net debts outstanding for that election. (11 CFR § 110.1(b)(3)(i))

If the foregoing conditions for reattributions or redesignations are not met within 60 days of receipt of the contribution, the excessive amount must be refunded. See 11 CFR § 103.3(b)(3).

Please inform the Commission of your corrective action immediately in writing and provide photocopies of any refund checks and/ or letters reattributing or redesignating the contributions in question. Refunds are reported on Line 28 of the Detailed Summary Page and on a supporting Schedule B-P of the report covering the period in which they are made. Redesignations and reattributions are reported as memo entries on Schedule A-P of the report covering the period in which the authorization for the redesignation and/or reattribution is received. (11 CFR §§ 104.8(d)(2), (3) and (4))

The acceptance of excessive contributions is a serious problem. Again, the committee's procedures for processing contributions should be examined and corrected in order to avoid this problem. Although the Commission may take further legal action, prompt action by you to refund, redesignate, and/or reattribute of the excessive amount will be taken into consideration.

2. Your report contains incorrect Column B figures for Lines 17(a), 17(e), 22, 23, 28(a), 28(d), and 30 of the Summary and Detailed Summary Page information. When aggregating and reporting receipts and disbursements, candidate committees are required to disclose their activity on an election-cycle basis, from 11/3/04 to 11/4/08. Please amend your report to show election cycle-to-date figures for all aggregate amounts. (2 U.S.C. § 434(b))

3. Line 23, Column A, of the Detailed Summary Page information of your report discloses negative \$1,813,735.44 in operating expenditures. The sum of all entries supporting that line is \$6,215,346.31. While it is permissible for the figure on Line 23, Column A, to exceed the sum of disbursement entries as a result of unitemized transactions, the sum of itemized disbursements may not exceed the figure provided on Line 23, Column A. Please amend your report to correct this discrepancy. (11 CFR § 104.3(b))

4. Schedule B-P of your report discloses disbursements to credit card companies. When reporting payments to credit card companies, if the payment to the original vendor aggregates in excess of \$200 in an election cycle, you must itemize, as a memo entry, the name and address of the original vendor, together with the date, amount and purpose of the expenditure. Your report lists payments to credit card companies as memo entries. Please clarify these memo entries. (11 CFR § 104.9(a) & (b))

Please note, you will not receive an additional notice from the Commission on this matter. Adequate responses must be received by the Commission on or before the due date noted above to be taken into consideration in determining whether audit action will be initiated. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act may also result in an enforcement action against the committee. Any response submitted by your committee will be placed on the public record and will be considered by the Commission prior to taking enforcement action. **Requests for extensions of time in which to respond will not be considered.**

Electronic filers must file amendments (to include statements, designations and reports) in an electronic format and must submit an amended report in its entirety, rather than just those portions of the report that are being amended. 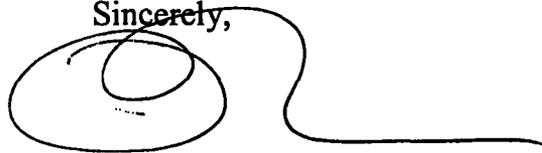

- Your response to the Commission's Request for Additional Information concerning the 2006 Year End Report indicated the committee made a disbursement on 2/28/05 to the Department of the Treasury, and the check was never cashed. It appears the original disbursement was never disclosed on the 2005 April Quarterly Report. The 2006 Year End Report disclosed a negative entry on Schedule B meant to offset this transaction. Since the original disbursement was never disclosed on the 2005 April Quarterly Report it resulted in a discrepancy with cash on hand calculations. Please amend this report and any subsequent reports to clarify the nature of these transactions. (2 U.S.C. § 434)(b)(7))
