

Dear Mr. Federspiel:

I am writing in response to your letter of August 16 regarding the July quarterly report, specifically missing information regarding occupation and employer.

At the outset, let me inform you that I am currently filing an amended report that provides some, but not all, of the information required.

I believe the committee's procedures fulfill the best efforts requirements of the FEC as follows:

- 1) In the original mailed solicitation we include a form that asks for name, address, employer and occupation and which includes the mandated language that informs the contributor that the reporting of such information is required by federal law.
- 2) When we receive a contribution that exceeds \$200 we send out a follow up letter, within 30 days, requesting the information and repeating the mandated language. We do not solicit a contribution in this letter. We do include a pre-addressed, postage paid, return envelope with the letter.
- 3) The information we obtain forms the basis for an amended report, showing Schedule A additions, that we submit with the next scheduled report, or before.

A copy of the relevant documents is enclosed.
