

Dear Mr. Federspiel,

RE: 30 Day Post General Report -- ID #C00272211

I am writing in response to your Dec. 27, 1994 letter which reached me on January 9, 1995.

With regard to a discrepancy on the summary page and the incorrect reporting of the beginning cash balance, I am filing an amended report with the Clerk of the House.

The apparantly excessive contribution to which you refer is, in fact, a contribution in excess of the \$1,000 per election limit for individuals. I and my committee are well aware of the limitations but this is one instance that simply escaped our detection in the hectic days at the close of the campaign. I have refunded the excess portion -- \$500 -- and I enclose copies of the check and my letter of transmittal. Heretofore, I have been the final check on compliance with FEC regulations prior to the mailing of the periodic reports. I have amended our procedures to require another individual, who is familiar with the regulations, to double check the reports, with special emphasis on those reports which are generated in the final busy days of primary and general campaigns. Our goal is to catch the excess contribution before the check is deposited and return it to the individual with an explanation of the regulations, including the possibility of reattribution or redesignation.

With regard to unreported contributions whose size and date would trigger the 48-hour notification requirement: I and my committee fully understand the requirement, as is evidenced by the approximately 20 48-hour notices that we filed. By my reckoning we filed 20 notices and missed three notices - which is three too many. In this case I am changing our internal procedures by narrowing, rather than widening, responsibilities. To avoid simple human error -- which was the factor in this case -- I am requiring individuals who process incoming contributions to report to me any contributions in excess of \$1,000 whenever they are received. I will make the final determination of whether these contributions are subject to the 48-hour notice provision.
