Candidate

Within 15 days after an individual becomes a candidate, he or she must designate a principal campaign committee.^{1,2} This designation is made by filing either a Statement of Candidacy (FEC Form 2) or a letter with the same information. 101.1(a) and 102.12(a). Senate candidates file with the Secretary of the Senate, and House candidates file with the Federal Election Commission. 105.1 and 105.2.³ A copy must also be filed with the Secretary of State (or equivalent state officer) in the state in which the candidate is running for office.⁴ 108.3 and 2 U.S.C. §439(a).

Principal Campaign Committee

Within 10 days after it has been designated by the candidate, the principal campaign committee must register by filing a Statement of Organization (FEC Form 1). 102.1(a). The committee files the registration form with the Secretary of the Senate or the Federal Election Commission, as appropriate.³ A copy must also be filed with the Secretary of State (or equivalent state officer) in the state in which the candidate is running for office.⁴ 2 U.S.C. §439(a).

1. A candidate may not designate, as the principal campaign committee or other authorized committee (except for a joint fundraising committee—see Appendix C), a committee that supports more than one candidate (e.g., a party committee or a political action committee). 102.12(c) and 102.13(c).
2. A political committee may incorporate for liability purposes only without becoming a corporation that is itself prohibited from making contributions or expenditures. 114.12(a).

NOTE: Public Law 104-73 changed the point-of-entry for reports and statements filed by House candidates. Prior to January 31, 1998, House candidates filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives; they now file with the FEC.

Candidate Must Register for Each Election Cycle

Candidate
 A candidate must file a new FEC Form 2 for each election in which he is a candidate. For example, Mr. Jones, who was a candidate in 1998, wishes to run again in 2000. He must file a new FEC Form 2

within 15 days after qualifying as a candidate (see Section 1) for the 2000 election.

Principal Campaign Committee
 The candidate may either redesignate his previous campaign committee (if it has not terminated) or designate a new principal campaign committee.
