# NORTH SLOPE NATURAL RESOURCES (NSNR) ACT

This act will open all of the North Slope of Alaska, both onshore and offshore, to responsible oil and gas development and will create the National Endowment for Wildlife. NSNR will treat the entire North Slope of Alaska in a comprehensive and holistic manner as the single ecosystem that it truly is. NSNR will equate the North Slope's natural energy resources of oil and gas with the North Slope's natural wildlife resources, responsibly developing the former while conserving the latter.

**Provision 1** - Will open all of the North Slope of Alaska, both onshore and offshore, to responsible oil and gas development using the latest drilling techniques to insure minimal wildlife disturbance.

**Provision 2** Will split all oil and gas royalties and revenues 90-10 between Alaska and the federal government.

**Provision 3** - Will create the lasting legacy of the North Slope and ANWR - the National Endowment for Wildlife (N.E.W.). The N.E.W. will receive 40 of Alaska's 90 percent share. The N.E.W. will be headquartered in Alaska. All of the money the N.E.W. receives from oil and gas development will be invested solely in long-term U.S. Treasury securities thereby creating a multi-billion dollar "Permanent Fund" for wildlife. Interest income will be used for wildlife and wilderness conservation throughout America. All states will receive a share of N.E.W. project money based on the percentage they have of total American public wildlife lands and the percentage they have of the total American coastline with no state receiving less than 0.5 percent of N.E.W. project money. Alaska will of course receive the "bear's share" of N.E.W. money because Alaska is where most of America's wildlife and wilderness - to say nothing of most of America's oil and gas - all are!

**Provision 4** - Will build both oil and gas pipelines via the shortest "over the top" route through Canada to deliver Alaska oil and gas to the American heartland.

**Provision 5** - Will build a gas pipeline parallel to the present Alaska oil pipeline to service Alaska and to also deliver oil and gas to the west coast of America.

**Provision 6** - Will create a special clean-up and restoration fund to restore all North Slope land as oil and gas development is completed.

**Provision 7** - Will contain strict environmental safeguards to regulate all North Slope oil and gas production.

**Provision 8** - Will allow all Americans - individuals, businesses, and nonprofits - to participate in the N.E.W. by opening their own U.S. Treasury Direct Accounts with their gift contributions to benefit their own wildlife and wilderness interests in consultation and cooperation with the N.E.W. board of directors.

**Provision 9** - Will direct that the state of Alaska Permanent Fund receive one-half of Alaska's share (90% - 40% N.E.W. = 50% divided by two = 25% of the total revenue) to benefit all Alaskans directly with continued PFDs. The other one-half (25% of the total revenue) will go to operate the Alaska state government.

Note: My NSNR legislation will of course be amended and modified as it goes through Congress, but I will do all I possibly can to see that it conforms to the intent I have expressed above.

## VOTE for "Big" Ted – U.S. Senate – running only to open ANWR!

My name is Ted Gianoutsos. I am running for the U.S. Senate solely to responsibly develop all our Alaska North Slope oil and gas natural energy resources while creating the National Endowment for Wildlife – N.E.W. When elected, I will introduce the "North Slope Natural Resources (NSNR) Act." (See over). I will concentrate all of my efforts on getting NSNR signed into law. I will not run for re-election. "Little" Ted Stevens and Don Young can certainly well represent Alaska on all other matters in the Senate and House respectively, allowing me to concentrate all my time and energy on NSNR.

ANWR is the most important element in Alaska's economic future. It also has the potential to insure future funding for the conservation of America's and Alaska's wildlife and wilderness. NSNR will guarantee Alaska's prosperity by producing the oil and gas natural energy to fuel America's "Life, liberty, and pursuit of happiness". NSNR will also create the N.E.W., headquartered here in Alaska, which will fund the conservation of wildlife and wilderness for as long as America and Alaska exist.

With all due respect to Lisa Murkowski, Tony Knowles, "Little" Ted Stevens, Don Young, and Frank Murkowski, the simple truth is that they have all had their chance on opening ANWR and they have all failed. They have always seized the losing oil low ground and given away the winning wildlife high ground to ANWR opponents. ANWR is only about oil and wildlife. No other tangential issues really matter.

We humans do not relate positively to crude oil. We see it as dirty, stinky, and problematical. We only like the benefits of oil. It literally fuels our lives, liberty, and pursuit of happiness. But there is huge disconnect in our minds between the benefits which we like, and the oil itself which we don't like.

There is no disconnect on wildlife. We are genetically programmed to respond positively to other mammalian critters, especially warm and fuzzy MAMA Caribou and her BABIES and cute, cuddly "Teddy-bears" of all kinds. NSNR will seize the highest possible wildlife ground by emphasizing the true lasting legacy of ANWR and North Slope oil and gas production – the creation of the N.E.W. ANWR opponents cannot oppose NSNR without exposing their own hypocrisy.

No one can better personify NSNR, N.E.W., and positive high wildlife ground ANWR legislation than my wife Françoise and I can. We founded the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation 20 years ago with our gift to our country. We got the Foundation legislation passed unanimously in Congress in 13 months with 60 co-sponsors, including 22 chairmen and the leadership of both parties in both Houses. We are in a unique position to repeat that unprecedented victory. Since becoming Alaskans we have championed stand-alone Veterans Homes, PFD Gift Assignment Philanthropy for the Alaska Common Good, and U.S. Treasury Direct Family Endowment Accounts for Alaska's nonprofits. Of course, we will continue to do all we can to build real stand-alone Veterans Homes, to promote PFD Gift Assignment Philanthropy, and to promote U.S. Treasury Direct Family Endowment Accounts. We view all three of these efforts as labors of love. We will work hard to accomplish these goals, regardless of whether or not I am elected to the Senate.

We are both registered Republicans. I have changed my registration to run as Non-Partisan because I believe ANWR is truly a nonpartisan issue in Alaska. Please sign my nomination petition to place my name on the November 2004 ballot. I will neither seek nor accept any contributions for my campaign. I will not run political ads. I will rely on word-of-mouth, the Internet, and the media to bring my candidacy to the attention of my fellow Alaskans. I only ask for your signature on my nomination petition, for your vote in November 2004, and for my chance to convince our fellow Americans that NSNR is in the best interest of all of us, and wildlife too!
